

Dr. Roby G. George has served as Director of Bands at Indiana State University, University of Illinois (Associate), University of Dayton, Fisk University, and at the prestigious New World School of the Arts in Miami. With degrees in Music Education from Florida State University (BME and MME), he received his Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in Wind Conducting from the Cincinnati - Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, with a cognate degree in woodwind performance.

Over the years, George has distinguished himself as a versatile conductor with his ensembles having performed at the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, the Banff International Music Festival in Canada, various conducting clinics in Mexico, Costa Rica, China, Germany, France, and throughout the United States. He has also served as the principal clinician at numerous band festivals across the country and established the Regali Chamber Winds and Wind Quintet.

With critical performances at such notable venues as Symphony Center in Chicago, Hill Auditorium on the campus of the University of Michigan, and Carnegie Hall, George now serves as the Interim Conductor of the Miami Wind Symphony, a standing guest conductor of the Greater Miami Symphonic Band and is a co-conductor of the Pinnacle Winds in Kansas City. He is a member of the Florida Music Educators Association and formerly a member of the College Band Directors National Association where he served as chairman of the Diversity Committee for 9 years.
