MY BASIC RULES FOR SUCCESS

- Nothing lasts for more than five minutes
- Do not let it get stale
- Read the room & adapt
- Use more than one method book
- Use their energy to your advantage
- Set the culture in the first five minutes
- Get them excited about class
- Make them feel loved & wanted

- Stay positive all the time
- Let them experience success
- Give every group a cool name
- Make it safe to take chances & fail
- Play for them daily
