

# Orff in Middle School: Chromatic Possibilities

At the San Francisco School, our Middle School program makes good use of the chromatic Orff instruments as a way of continuing Elemental music making (kinesthetic, body-based, featuring improvisation and other forms of student creativity) and also moving into music of greater sophistication, suitable for older students. In this workshop we will experience two examples.

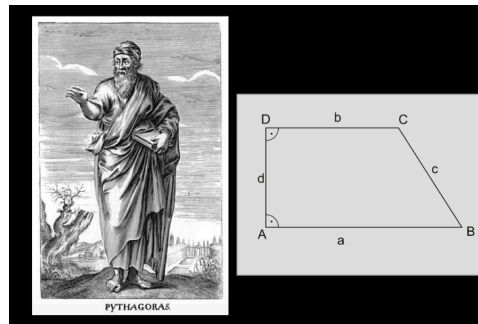
## 6th Grade example: Misirlou (Greek/Armenian/Turkish Folk song)

Warm-up Activities:

Chant: "Pythagoras was Greek"

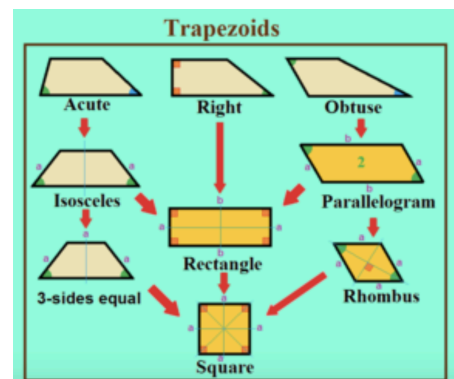
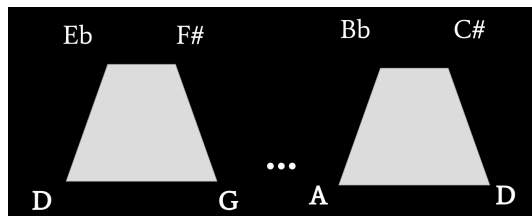
Body percussion pattern (Baladi rhythm):

Pat clap clap pat clap snap



Variation: With a partner, use elastic to create a trapezoid during the chant

D Hijaz (Hijaz kar) Scale: D Eb F# G A Bb C# D

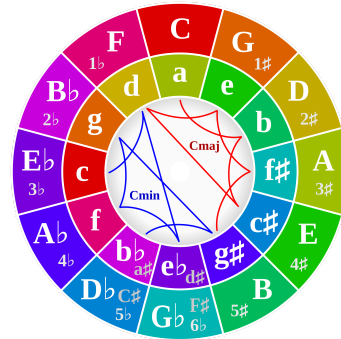
Form: Improvisation by soloists during held tones Misirlou Dance: YouTube



8th Grade example: Moonglow ( A Jazz Standard)

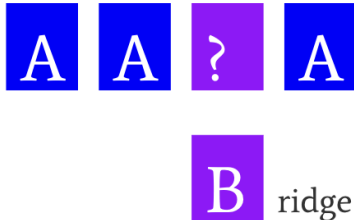


Circle of 5ths Exercise (descending chromatic tritones)

come from ev'rywhere

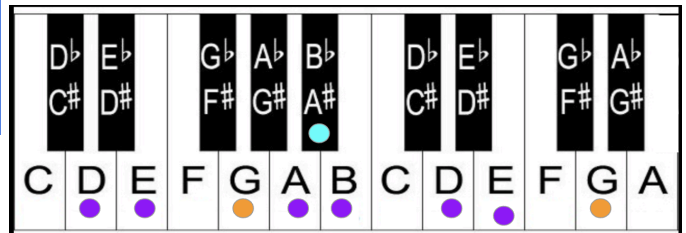
And now that there's
