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Connecting with classroom culture

Welcome to the best part of your day

- You have to MEAN it
- Making music with them is the best part of my day, not the boring adult stuff
- It's OK to get excited when the group sounds great!
 - o though I usually scare the kids when I do this
- Tell them when the opportunity arises in class

Tenets of Band Kwan Do

- And how it relates on an everyday basis
- YOU are the model
- The director IS the culture
- You have to be authentic and honest
- This IS social/emotional learning/development
- Use inclusive language our, we with kids and parents
 - o a strong program is a collaboration at all levels
 - o say kids instead of students sometimes
- Use it during class when the opportunity arises

Connecting through shared experience

REMEMBER what it was like to be a middle schooler

- Were you the popular kid, the quiet kid, the weird kid?
- Younger teachers, you're not that far away from their experience
- For me, an 80's kid, it can be harder to relate, so thank you Stranger Things!

Notice I didn't say kids are ADULTS too

- You can be honest and authentic with them
 - o but not condescending
 - o treat each age group differently

But they are NOT adults

- Communicate on their level
- To me that's the weakness of parents and sometimes teachers they forgot what it was like to be a kid, the stupid things you did, the awkwardness
- Emotional quality of music
 - o children have life experience too, just different from yours
 - o for example, what do Misterioso or With Energy mean to them?
- A great way to get on their level learn a new, ENJOYABLE instrument!
