What can I do in the semesters BEFORE my student teaching experience to help prepare?






- ? Develop your musicianship and teachership
- ? Develop mastery skills on your primary instrument
- ? Develop more advanced skills on at least one secondary instrument
- ? Perform in your major ensemble(s)
- ? Explore ensemble participation outside of your primary area
- ? Seek opportunities to play for FUN!
- ? Listen and analyze scores for solos, chamber ensembles, and large-group ensembles in your discipline...and BEYOND!

- ? Explore musical teaching opportunities
- ? Seek out opportunities to purposefully observe classrooms and rehearsals
- ? Subscribe to email lists for publishers/distributors, music teaching blogs, and music teaching Facebook groups
- ? Explore other tutoring opportunities
- ? Swap a lesson with a colleague
- ? Purposefully take on organization and administrative opportunities
- ? Prepare for your Certification Exams
- ? Look into certifications in CPR and others that may be required for you



- ? Become involved in professional organizations
- ? Draw from other job experiences
- ? Write professional correspondence to all professors, educators, and other contacts EVERY TIME. Maintain a professional rapport with all professors and educators.
- ? Maintain a professional persona on social media and the internet
- ? Maintain a professional rapport with your student colleagues. They will be your professional colleagues forever!

- Plan your courses, summer classes, and summer plans (festivals, teaching at camps, others) early.
- ? Create a personal, professional website or portfolio
- ? Collect videos of your performance and teaching activities
- ? Collect interview questions online and from your professors
- ? Dress professionally when observing in the schools and working with other professionals

What can I do in the IMMEDIATE semester before my student teaching experience to help prepare?






- ? Continue suggestions above
- ? Check out/Rent a secondary instrument to practice. Choose another secondary instrument to work on.

- ? Continue suggestions above
- ? Continue to expand your teaching experiences through practicum and peer teaching experiences
- ? Take your Certification Exams (when given clearance)
- ? Submit your application for Student Teacher Placement (and other paperwork)
- ? Register and complete your CPR and other certifications
- ? Challenge yourself. Take a course outside your discipline.



- ? Continue suggestions above
- ? Update your resume, cover letter. Edit, edit, edit!
- ? Update your personal, professional website or portfolio
- ? Acquire professional attire for your student teaching experience
- ? Schedule a meeting with your cooperating teacher/Learn about your school
- ? Know how to obtain a copy of your official transcript and how much they cost.
- ? Begin contacting those that you would like to have serve as a reference for you.

What can I do DURING my student teaching experience to get the most out of it?





- ? Continue to make music!
- ? Attend musical performances (and rehearsals) of other ensembles
- ? Play/Sing in classes (especially beginner classes on instruments you are less familiar with!)

Educator **APPLY**

- ? Jump in!
- ? Apply your previous knowledge and experiences
- ? Absorb the new strategies you are learning in the field.
- ? Challenge yourself
- ? Never refuse an opportunity to teach
- ? Be open to advice and constructive criticism
- ? Don't be afraid to make a mistake. You are human. But learn from it.

Educator ANALYZE

- ? Document that inner monologue
- ? Separate Observation from Inference
- ? Gather all the things!

Educator REFLECT

- ? Take time to reflect
- ? Once you have collected items from your cooperating teacher, find a time to ask questions about them and the choices that teacher made to create them.
- ? Be PROACTIVE—Not REACTIVE.
- ? Celebrate your progress daily!



- ? "It's a lot of work"
- ? "Take care of yourself—sleep, eat right, drink water, wash your hands"
- ? Ask to be introduced to campus administration, teachers, and staff. Do not be shy—reach out to them. Shows initiative.
- ? Speak to other teachers/staff in your building, district, and region. Get to know them!
- ? Role Identity
- ? Continue to be involved in professional organizations
- ? Continue building professional relationships
